As you may know, the principal of Bowraville Central School, Malcolm McFarlane, won a scholarship from the Harvard Club of Australia and was chosen to speak in front of 190 other motivated principals from 15 other countries. A picture of our garden was shown and it was touted as one of the most beautiful community gardens on a world scale – well done Bowraville!

But we are only just beginning! Perhaps less than a 3rd of the way through our overall concept design, we have a long way to go. Imagine how beautiful they will be - even a community pizza oven is on the agenda! Although we do have very exciting leads on where the next funding may come from, we are

They know heaps about growing food and judging by the beautifully manicured seeds that Tom donated to the seed exchange, they are masters at seed saving!

Another such visitor that had us all laughing has a Bachelor's Degree in 'Mastery of the Now'. But he is not yet 3 and I'm sure, as his parents would testify, a whole other story. Wonderful to see these three minds sharing the wooden bench, wisdom and mandarins! We would love to meet an encyclopaedia (or two!) on native foods. We would like our native food section to be a jungle of food to sample and learn about. If anyone has the knowledge and time to nurture it you

are very welcome.

We also had a visit from Steve from the Bellingen community gardens, another excellent source of nonhybrid seedlings and seeds. If you're in Bello you may like to take the time to have a sticky beak. Thanks so much for the seedlings donated Steve; we look forward to the mutual support both our gardens can give each other.

Work has begun on an 'outdoor classroom/picnic area'. This will be an open space with grapes or kiwi fruit and/or passionfruit to give cooling shade in summer and warm sun in winter.

Thanks to all those who have donated anything from pots, seeds, plants, time, to sharing stories, cuppas, laughter and energy. Too many to mention!

The hero of the month has to be Laurel. Even though

her car was wiped out by another, she still picked up some buckets to donate to the gardens! Thanks so much Laurel, above and beyond!

Many thanks to the Central School for donating a wonderful cabinet for our seed exchange. This will be immensely helpful in organising the collection.

A thousand thanks also to Tom who has donated some fantastic seeds this month;

including the rare yet sort after ox-heart tomato. These tomatoes can be as big as two fists and are soft skinned with a fabulous flavour. We are looking for some dedicated tomato growers and seed savers to propagate them and save the seeds. SCAMS, SWINDLES, RORTS AND RIP-OFFS Be aware of the scams and take measures to protect yourself.

Money transfer requests

Money transfer scams are on the rise. Be very careful when someone offers you money to help transfer their funds. Once you send money to someone it can be very difficult, if not almost impossible, to get it back.

What to look for

The **Nigerian scam** is one of the most complained about scams in Australia. Although many of these sorts of scams originate in Nigeria, similar scams have been started by scammers all over the world (particularly in other parts of West Africa and in Asia). These scams are increasingly referred to as '**advance fee fraud**'.

In the classic Nigerian scam you receive an email or letter from a scammer asking your help to transfer a large amount of money overseas.

You are then offered a share of the money if you agree to give them your bank account details to help with the transfer. They will then ask you to pay all kinds of taxes and fees before you can receive your 'reward'. You will never be sent any of the money and will lose the fees you paid. Then there is the scam email that claims to be from a lawyer or bank representative advising



that a long-lost relative of yours has died and left you a huge **inheritance**. Scammers can tell such genuine sounding stories that you could be tricked into providing personal documents and bank account details so that you can confirm their identity and claim your inheritance.

The 'inheritance' is likely to be non-existent and as well as losing any money you might have paid to the scammer in fees and taxes, you could also risk having your identity stolen.

If you or your business is selling products or services online or through newspaper classifieds, you may be targeted by an **overpayment scam**.

In response to your advertisement you might receive a generous offer from a potential buyer and accept it. You receive payment by cheque or money order but the amount you receive is more than the agreed price. The buyer may tell you that the overpayment was simply a mistake or they may invent an excuse, such as extra money to cover delivery charges. If you are asked to refund the excess amount by money transfer, be suspicious. The scammer is hoping that you will transfer the refund before you discover that their cheque has bounced or their money order was phony. You will lose the transferred money as well as the item if you have already sent it.



REMEMBER: If you have been approached by someone asking you to transfer money for them, make sure that it is from a legitimate source.

CAUTION: Never send money or give credit card or online account details to anyone you do not know and trust.

THINK: Don't accept a cheque or money order for payment for goods that is more than what you agreed upon. Send it back and ask the buyer to send you payment for the agreed amount before you deliver the goods or services.

INVESTIGATE: Examine the information on SCAMwatch (www.scamwatch.gov.au) for information on how to protect yourself against money transfer scams.

ASK YOURSELF: Is it really safe to transfer money for someone you do not know?

National Stroke Week - 8th-14th September



Health check a life saver

Local residents are being urged to take advantage of a quick, free and simple health check that could save your life.

During National Stroke Week, The Pharmacy Guild of Australia's New South Wales Branch will host health checks at participating pharmacies.

National Stroke Foundation Chief Executive Officer Dr Erin Lalor urged locals to make the most of the free checks.

"Take five minutes out of your day and get your numbers checked, it may save your life," Dr Lalor said.

Often known as the silent killer because there may be no symptoms, high blood pressure is a key risk factor for stroke. The only way to know your blood pressure is to have it checked.

"Nearly four million Australians over 25 have high blood pressure but many do not know it, putting their health and lives at risk," Dr Lalor said.

By checking blood pressure and completing a simple type 2 diabetes risk assessment questionnaire, pharmacists will be able to help identify people who may be at risk of stroke and related conditions. Those at risk will be referred to their doctor for advice on how to lower their risk and to stay healthy.

"One in six people will have a stroke in their lifestyle. These people are you, your family, your friends, your colleagues. Yet only around half of Australians know the signs of stroke and one in 10 couldn't spot a stroke if it happened right in front of them," Dr Lalor said.

"Stroke is largely preventable and usually very simple to identify but most people simply don't know enough about it."

"Get involved this National Stroke Week and unite with us to help raise awareness of stroke and encourage all Australians to take action to reduce their risk of stroke."

Gardens, Gardening and Gardeners Vegetables you've possibly never heard of

Celeriac

This delicious root vegetable makes for a great seasonal alternative to the potato in the winter and is an excellent source of dietary fiber. Celeriac is also noteworthy among root vegetables in that it contains very little starch. So those looking to cut the starch from their diet can still enjoy all those "potato snacks" by replacing the potato with celeriac.

Dulse

Seaweed found clinging to a shoreline might not be something that typically whets your appetite but you might be pleasantly surprised by dulse. Common in the North Atlantic, this vegetable-of-the-sea is called "söl" in Iceland and is served in everything from soup to casseroles. It is a rich source of vitamin B and fiber and a good source of vegetable protein. It has also traditionally been used to help prevent goiter, as it contains plenty of iodine.

Fiddleheads

Fiddleheads look more like alien appendages than a vegetable but they are actually the furled fronds of a baby fern. One reason they're rare is that they are not cultivated — only harvested from the wild. Foraging for fiddleheads is also for experts only. Much like mushrooms, not all ferns are edible and some are poisonous. They are packed with nutrients and acclaimed for their succulent flavor. Fiddleheads are full of omega-3 fatty acids and fibe, and contain twice the antioxidant quality of blueberries. Garlic Scapes

You'll notice in early to mid-October that your garlic is sending up a stalk from the centre of the plant. The stalk is thicker than the leaves and is called the garlic scape. The scape, if left on the plant, will form a flower and then seed (you can eat those tiny seeds, using a garlic press is the best way to do that).

By cutting off the scape you are asking the plant to send all of its energy into increasing the bulb size rather than in putting energy toward flowers and seed. Since the bulb is what we eat it makes sense to cut the scape. Plus, scapes are delicious and can be used just like garlic but they are ready a month or two before the garlic bulb.

To cut your scape, wait until the center stalk completely forms and grows above the rest of the plant. As it grows up it will begin to curl or spiral upward. At that point, cut the stalk as far down as you can without cutting any leaves off. Kai-Lan

Sometimes referred to as "Chinese broccoli", kai-lan is a nutritious leafy green common in Cantonese cuisine. Its leaves make a delicious complement in salads and can be served in any meal that might otherwise include broccoli. In fact, the hybrid vegetable broccolini is a cross between broccoli and kai-lan.

More unusual vegies another time.

What to plant in September . . .

Plant in Garden: Beans, beetroot, carrots, Chinese cabbage, chives, cucumber, lettuce, parsnips, potatoes, pumpkins, rhubarb, silverbeet, spring onions, sweet corn, sweet potato/kumara, turnips. *Start in Seed Trays:* Cabbage, capsicum, celery, eggplant, tomatoes, zucchini. *Plant out Seedlings:* Basil, leeks. - *from www.gardenate.com*

They move out fast so be quick it one interests you.

Unstolen by Wendy Jean

This novel was inspired by a true story – the abduction of a boy from a school playground in Canada in 1991.

The 'unstolen' is Bethany Fisher. She was only a baby when her brother Michael went missing at the age of four. Bethany never knew Michael but her mother's



unrelenting belief that one day he will come home, her stories about Michael and her subsequent unusual way of behaving as though he will walk in the door at any moment means that Bethany hears a lot about her brother as she grows up. She lives in his shadow.

Over protecting her and guarding her every move, "Mama" (as Bethany calls her) ensures Bethany completes her education at a young age, has few friends and often misses out on the usual experiences of child and teenage-hood.

Bethany is a girl who feels as though she doesn't measure up, she has to be strong, stay safe, not express her opinions and do what is expected of her. Even though she is fed, clothed and educated, in many ways Bethany is neglected by her mother – there isn't much affection going on, she is bombarded with "count yourself lucky" and "you should be grateful", always overshadowed by the brother who isn't there.

At twenty-something, with a four year old son, Bethany is suddenly faced with a mother who follows a strange man home from the supermarket, bludgeons him to death and remembers nothing of the incident. I enjoyed this book – reading 'the other side of the story' so to speak, from the perspective of the sibling left behind. Yes, it's a novel but what does one do to survive such a thing? What impact does this sort of tragedy have on a family? How does one cope with a mother who can't let go of the past? What behaviours does one adopt? What small lies and what secrets abound?



For all you **Jodi Piccoult** fans, here is another spell binder.

Second Glance is a ghost story, set in a small New England town. When a plot of land is being developed in Vermont against the will of a local Native American tribe, very weird things begin to happen. Ross Wakeman, a paranormal investigator gets involved. He is a desperate drifter who has taken up ghost hunting in an effort to cross paths again with his fiancée, who died in a car crash eight years ago. Ross has yet to experience anything even remotely paranormal. Then he meets Lia....

As a seventy year old murder case is reopened, a shocking secret about a crime of passion long past is revealed.

True to Piccoult's form, her novel is about human interaction and the relationships we have; it's about the different types and depth of love people experience; it' about mystery and belief.

Where did that saying come from?

To Let the Cat Out of the Bag... At markets or at county fairs in the old days, the customer had to be on guard against dishonest traders. A housewife, for instance, canting to buy a live piglet might apparently be offered a discount if she bought a 'prepacked' one, sight unseen—tied up in a small san ready for carrying off home. This small sack was called a *poke* (related to pocket and pouch). Some unscrupulous traders reputedly tied a stray cat up in the sack instead. The purchaser, keen to inspect the piglet before actually buying it, would untie the sack ... and *let the cat out of the bag*. The expression duly entered general use in the sense of 'to reveal a trick or secret'. It's likely that the phrase *to be sold a pup* has the same source.
