

The Shadow of the Wind

by Carlos Ruiz Zafon

Carlos Ruiz Zafon is Spanish and "The Shadow of the Wind" was on the bestseller list in Spain for two years and was also a number one bestseller in Germany. It is yet another great novel!!

It took me a while to get through Zafon's story – more so because I needed to apply myself, a greater level of concentration was required.


The main character is Daniel Sempere, the son of a bookseller. The setting is Barcelona in 1945.

When Daniel is old enough his father takes him to the secret Cemetery of Forgotten Books where he must choose a single book, promise to take care of it and keep it alive always. Daniel is drawn to and selects "The Shadow of the Wind".

He reads the book, becomes completely bewitched by it and obsessive about finding out all he can of the author Julian Carax. Soon Daniel's life becomes filled with discoveries about love and obsession, art and life, secrets and danger and how they are entangled within the shadow world of books.

Along the way he 'adopts', Fermin Romero de Torres, a tramp he meets on the streets of Barcelona, takes him home to his father whom Daniel coerces into giving de Torres a job in the bookstore and there begins the deepest of friendships.

"The Shadow of the Wind" is a love story, a thriller, a novel with many twists and turns (hence the having to



concentrate so hard!!) and hopefully it will capture you as it did me.

Theodore Boone by John Grisham

This is relatively short story and a quick read. It's part of a series but I was unaware of this until the end of the novel and don't think it really matters anyway. However, I enjoyed it so much I feel as though I need to read the first one, to learn the origin of young Theodore Boone.

Theodore is thirteen years old, the only child of lawyer parents. His mother is a court practicing lawyer and his dad spends most of his time in his office doing real estate law. They spend a lot quality time with Theo, at least one of them attending his school debates and both taking an interest in everything in his life. Theo, as he prefers to be called, spends most afternoons after school at his parents' office where he indulges his interest in law and justice and appears to have free reign (within reason – no snooping allowed!) including his own little 'office'. Their parenting style appeals to me!

His friend Hardie Quinn approaches him one day with the worry that his grandparents' home is about to be bulldozed and the land taken to make way for a bypass that many in the town regard as a complete waste of money and a detriment to the community and environment. Hardie enlists Theo's help and when Theo stumbles on a secret (that he has no right to know of) about the corrupt men behind the bypass plan, they soon embark on a strategy to keep the developers from going ahead.

Gardens, Gardening and Gardeners

Spice up your Garden

There's no need to wait for spices to arrive via ancient trade routes, you can grow your own and savour the heady fragrance and flavours of a fresh harvest.

For 2000 years spices were rare and exotic goods, brought through Asia via dangerous inland routes along with cargoes of silks, aromatics and precious stones, literally from the other side of the world. By the time these spices had reached the eastern Mediterranean port of Antioch in Turkey and had been carried still further by ship to Europe they were expensive and prized.

The spices brought back throughout history were probably no worse in quality than the desiccated powders and seeds stacked in rows of identical jars on supermarket shelves, a pale imitation of the complex aromas and richer flavours of freshly harvested plants and seeds. However, many spices are now readily available as living plants or seed so home gardeners can grow and harvest the real thing these days - freshly grated roots, seeds still fragrant with volatile oils and leaves which don't crumble at a touch into a greyish dust.

Gingers

The ginger family includes around 20 species with edible, pungent leaves or fruits although most are best known for the taste of their thick and fleshy underground rhizomes. All gingers need protection from the hottest sun, preferably by the shade of other plants to ensure humidity remains moderately high, while the roots are maturing. Rhizomes suitable for planting are available from greengrocers; choose thick -skinned pieces with paler, swollen, growing tips.

Turmeric (Curcuma longa)

Turmeric is closely related to ginger though its stems are shorter and the leaves are broader and the much smaller rhizomes resemble some kind of orange grub. These are dried and powdered to make the familiar

yellow spice, valued more as a food colouring than for its flavour. The roots are more potent and should be used in smaller quantities.

Galangal (Alpinia galanga)

Galangal is the most cold-tolerant of the edible gingers. Potted plants can be grown outdoors as long as they are moved to more sheltered spots during winter to protect them from frosts and cold, wet soils. The taste of galangal is reminiscent of ginger but more subtle with a lighter and fruitier aroma.

Cardamom (Elettaria cardamomum)

Cardamom is also a ginger but is grown for its fragrant fruits with overtones of eucalyptus. The freshly harvested pods are sweetly pungent but lose most of their volatile essences once ground or dried. Cardamom is almost as cold-tolerant as galangal but will only flower and set fruit in tropical and subtropical conditions.

Cinnamon (Cinnamomum verum)

Cinnamon is becoming increasingly available in warmer climates and can be harvested even from a large potted plant. In ancient times this was the fragrance of divine worship, as well as a sensual luxury, but it is now mostly used as an aromatic, spicy addition to cakes and other confectionery.

Cumin and other annual spices

Many of the common herbs of cooler climates also produce seeds that are used as spices, including coriander, fennel, dill, caraway, anise, cumin and black cumin. Not all of them are easy to grow; coriander needs cooler conditions or it will run to seed too quickly while still very small, while others are slow and tricky to germinate although they may crop readily enough once growing.

"You've got Buckley's" - Where did that saying come from?

William Buckley (1780 to 30 January, 1856) was an English convict who was transported to Australia. He escaped from captivity and was given up for dead. He was found close to death by aboriginals who cared for him because they believed he was the ghost of the much loved leader. He lived with the aboriginals who cared him for many years but became tired of the constant fighting.

Buckley's improbable survival is believed by many Australians to be the source of the vernacular phrase "you've got Buckley's or none" (or simply "you've got Buckley's"), which means "no chance", or "it's as good as impossible".

NAMBUCCA SHIRE CYCLEWAY PLAN REVIEW DRAFT AVAILABLE FOR COMMENT

Nambucca Shire Council has a draft review of its current cycleway plan out for public comment until 18 September 2015. The consultation period has been extended.

The current plan dates from 2010 and Council decided that a five-year review was due given changes associated with the construction of the new Pacific Highway and the growth in cycling for recreation, transport and tourism over the last few years.

Council is keen to hear from the community about what the priorities should be for cycleways, keeping in mind the limited resources available to Council to construct the infrastructure.

It is intended that the adopted plan will set the priorities for funding through developer contributions and grant assistance.

The draft review is available on Council's website at <u>www.nambucca.nsw.gov.au</u> under the "Documents on Exhibition" tab.

Submissions should be in writing, either in a letter addressed to the General Manager or via email <u>council@nambucca.nsw.gov.au</u> and should be submitted by 18 September.

How Happiness can Grow Your Memory

As if feeling grumpy wasn't a drag enough unto itself, scientists have discovered yet another drawback to a negative mood; it can handicap your brain's ability to record new memories. What's more, bad moods can trigger the calling forth of negative experiences from your past, a neuroscientific phenomenon known as 'mood congruence'.

Senior Lecturer in Psychology at Central Queensland University Talitha Best explains: "Mood and memory share overlapping neural networks and brain regions, so changes in mood can be accompanied by reduced cognitive speed and processes."

The upside is that the opposite also holds true. When good vibes flow your brain receives a boost. "This has positive effects on cognitive abilities such as memory, planning, organising and decision making. Encoding information, flexibility and innovative thinking processes are enhanced," Best says.

Try these tips for a good mood and to strengthen your memory: 1. Melt stress with meditation - stress activates the release of the hormone cortisol, which interferes with neural growth, learning and your physical health. This has a big implication for an aging population: use it or lose it – which applies to the brain as well as other aspects of life.

2. Solidify healthy habits - a consistently nutritious diet is like fertiliser for the brain. It's not so much about what or how much, but rather the habitual pattern of fruit, vegetable and nut intake across the mid-life that is related to better brain health in older adulthood. Steer clear of high-fat and highly refined carbohydrates, too. These foods are linked to brain tissue shrinkage in older adulthood.

3. Make yourself available - staying socially connected gives your grey matter a boost, so make time for catch-ups. Social connection, interaction and emotional attachment are important for supporting neural connections in regions of the brain related to memory performance.




