
Seats are limited and childcare restraints can be fitted if required - when booking your seat please give pick-up address, if you require child restraints, age of child/children and contact details.


Windows Reliability Monitor



Broken Harbour by Tana French

This novel is a 'whodunit' and in places felt a little drawn out for my liking – the very in-depth conversations between the two detectives felt like too much information but at the same time the to-ing and fro-ing discussions are no doubt a huge part of how cops figure out who did what.

Mick Kennedy is the main Murder Detective. He has a high solve rate, he has a newbie detective, Richie, under his supervision and he is seriously well controlled, portraying confidence and an air of being in charge.

Broken Harbour is home to a new subdivision that has failed dismally — many of the houses haven't been finished and those that have, have many faults. Few of the houses are occupied and the residents of those are not happy. Pat, Jenny and their 2 children own one of the new houses but it appears to have a problem with some sort of animal getting into the attic space. From all accounts they are a happy couple, as in love as they were when they met as teenagers.

Pat and the two children end up dead; Jenny left for dead. Both of the adults have horrendous knife injuries and the house is splattered with blood. The children have been smothered. Whoever murdered them had access to the house.

Detective Kennedy spent his childhood holidays at Broken Harbour with mostly happy memories to show for it. It's a wild beautiful place to him; a lonely, desolate dump to others.

Now he has a horror to deal with and it is taking its toll.

The Penance Room by Caroline Coffey

I cannot remember the last time I was moved to tears (at

the end) by a novel and I think this is a great story.

The setting is a large, old house in Broken Hill, now a nursing home. The occupants are mostly older foreigners, people who emigrated to Australia a long time ago either as children or as adults but are now living there because they have nowhere else to go or are in need of care. Each struggles with their day to day life because they are troubled by their pasts. The staff, also a mixture of nationalities, have ended up there for a myriad of reasons, all with their own stories to tell.

The house belongs to, and is run by, Emma and her husband and the story is told by their thirteen year old son Christopher. Deaf since childhood, his foot severed in an horrific accident, Christopher notices what others miss. Isolated and ignored, he is obsessed with helping these damaged souls find the peace they crave.

When Steve, a Master's Degree student, comes to hear the life experiences of the aging immigrant population as part of his research, each of the residents has to face their past and their stories are shared and felt by everyone. Christopher is very wrapped up in these stories, keen to understand why the people he cares about suffer as they do. He feels that they will be transformed by their 'confessions'.

But, will delving into the past be more damaging to the already fragile mental states of most of the residents? Will Emma, Christopher and his father wish that Steve had never appeared?

How do you know if someone is having a stroke? Think... F.A.S.T.

What are the signs of an impending stroke?

We have an easy way for everyone to recognise the signs of stroke: FAST

- Face has the person's face drooped?
- Arms can the person raise both arms?
- Speech is their speech slurred?
- Time call 000 immediately.

How can stroke be prevented? Eat well, keep a healthy weight, don't

eat well, keep a healthy weight, don't smoke, keep blood pressure down, exercise regularly and keep alcohol consumption to a minimum.



What is a stroke?

- A stroke is the way we describe the blood supply to the brain being suddenly cut off.
- Blood travels to the brain in blood vessels, called arteries.
- This can happen in two ways: Blood can stop moving through the artery when it gets blocked by a clot or when the artery bursts.
- Brain cells can quickly die without the oxygen that the blood supplies.
- This is why it is so important to get to hospital immediately if you think you are having a stroke because it is possible there may be some cells that can survive if you are treated quickly.

How does it affect people?

- Because the brain controls everything we do the way we think, move, speak, eat stroke can leave people with a wide range of physical and cognitive changes and disabilities.
- Some of the effects can include paralysis, speech and swallowing difficulties, problems with memory, hearing and eyesight it all depends on where in the brain the stroke occurs and how severe it is.

Who is at risk?

- Men or women stroke can happen to anyone it does not discriminate.
- Age group risk factors increase with age but stroke occurs at all ages.

What are some of the causes of stroke?

- There are many causes or risk factors, some are controllable and some are less so.
- Some of the causes within our control include high blood pressure, a family history of stroke, being overweight, smoking, high cholesterol, a high intake of alcohol and diabetes
- TIA, or mini-stroke, is also an indicator of a future stroke so it's important to know what it is and seek help immediately.





5 Flowers to Plant for Natural Pest Control

Companion planting, a practice used by organic and biodynamic gardeners, is the term given when one plants certain types of plants near each other because they are mutually beneficial. In the case of growing food in a garden plot there are a number of flowers you can plant for natural pest control. Toss out the pesticides (or wait, maybe you should contact the EPA to find out how to properly dispose of that toxic waste) and instead plant some attractive and aromatic flowers. Ah, that's biodynamic gardening for you.

Borage

What it is: This annual produces star-shaped flowers and is wonderful used in herbal teas, tinctures and leafy green recipes.

What it's good for: Borage deters cabbage worms and can help all plants increase their disease resistance.

Chrysanthemums

What it is: These popular flowers are common in flower arrangements as they come in a wide spectrum of colors.

What it's good for: Chrysanthemums contain a chemical called pyrethin that's toxic to insects but safe for human and animal consumption. Aside from planting these colorful flowers around your garden bed you can also make a tea from the flowers and use it on root nematodes.

Clover

What it is: This common ground cover grows as grass does, providing a thin, cohesive layer of green over the soil. There are over 300 varieties to choose from but the most popular is marked by small green clovers with tiny pink flowers.

What it's good for: Clover has been known to ward off pests completely when used as ground cover in garden beds. Plant it around cabbage to prevent cabbageworm and aphids from taking hold.

Lavender

What it is: Known for its delicate, violet leaves and pleasing aroma, lavender is used in everything from potpourri to tea and baked goods to frosting.

What it's good for: Lavender not only repels pests in your garden it also smells (and looks) heavenly. It's used to repel most insects you'd want to keep out of the garden, particularly fleas, moths and mosquitoes.

Marigolds

What it is: Marigolds are a popular garden flower as they are cheap to obtain and contain vibrant yellow/ orange hues.

What it's good for: Plant the scented varieties of marigolds to deter pests. The French Marigold variety is recommended for keeping whiteflies away from tomatoes and they protect the health of the soil under the plants.







Bowra Newsagency's getting a facelift



Council's biggest infrastructure project ever, the off river water storage area just out of Bowraville was completed in October 2014 and the ceremony marking the completion of the dam's construction was held in February this year and was opened by the Deputy Prime Minister, the Hon Warren Truss.



Bowra Dam is presently at 30% capacity and waiting for more rain. During

filling Council is required to release a percentage of the runoff water from rainfall to Bowra Creek. Once the dam is 60% full all runoff water must be released. The dam is not expected to be completely filled until mid 2016.

Reborn Artist now in Bowraville

Reborning is the art of repainting a toy doll so it looks like a real baby.

This is a hobby enjoyed by men and women all over the world has become an art form and business in its own right. Lovers of this art form are captivated by the realistic look and feel of the dolls which are so lifelike that they can invoke an emotional response for some which is similar to holding a real baby.

It started long ago with someone stripping the paint off a baby doll and repainting the doll to look more realistic. This art form has come a long way with some artists sculpting new soft vinyl kits to paint up. Before any work has been done a doll looks like lifeless plastic but after many hours of delicate work and painting these baby dolls can look so life like, that it is hard to tell that they are not a real baby.

How I Reborn a Doll

Each doll is different but it takes between 20 and 40 thin layers of paint

with each individual layer being baked in a small oven to set before applying the next layer. This is required to give the dolls their realism and uniqueness, with little capillaries and veins, mottling in their skin, birthmarks and even little scratches that babies will do to themselves especially on photo days. Then comes layers of a special sealing coat (my secret) which I do to give the skin little pores.

Once the painting is completed it's time to give the doll some hair. I use high quality mohair because it is a natural fibre which has the fine feel and look of baby hair and it is available in the same natural colours as human hair. The mohair is put in one strand at a time with a felting needle as are the eyelashes and brows. Dolls can be asleep (eyes shut) or awake (eyes open). Awake dolls require realistic eyes (glass or plastic) to be inserted into the eye socket. Magnets are also set inside the doll to hold in place dummies or hair clips etc. Once completed the inside of the doll is sealed using waterproof glue.

The doll is now assembled with high quality fill and is weighted with glass beads to give a realistic feel to the doll, also inside is a powder scented pack to give the doll that new baby smell.

A good quality doll can take up to a month to complete and dolls can be tailor made with eye colour, hair colour and skin tones being requested by the purchaser.

All my dolls are sold with the following items.

Name Bracelet - 2 baby dummies - 2 sets of gender appropriate clothes and suitable baby nappies - Birth certificate with name date, time and weight - care instructions - and if a girl, hair bows.


