#### ~~ TECH TALK ~ SOME OF THE BASICS ~~

#### What is WiFi and how does it work?

WiFi is a technology that uses radio waves to provide network connectivity. A WiFi connection is established using a wireless adapter to create hotspots - areas in the vicinity of a wireless router that are connected to the network and allow users to access internet services. Once configured WiFi provides wireless connectivity to your devices, by emitting frequencies between 2.4GHz - 5GHz, based on the amount of data on the network.

#### What does WiFi stand for?

You may be surprised to hear that many people don't actually know that *WiFi* is an abbreviated term. Even those who do don't always know what WiFi stands for. There are a number of theories about what the term means but the most widely accepted definition for the term in the tech community is Wireless Fidelity.

#### An Introduction to WiFi

Wireless technology has widely spread lately and you can get connected almost anywhere; at home, at work, in libraries, schools, airports, hotels and even in some restaurants.

Wireless networking is known as WiFi or 802.11 networking. The major advantage of WiFi is that it is compatible with almost every operating system, game device, and advanced printer.

#### How WiFi Works

Like mobile phones a WiFi network makes use of radio waves to transmit information across a network. The computer should include a wireless adapter that will translate data sent into a radio signal. This same signal will be transmitted, via an antenna, to a decoder known

as the router. Once decoded the data will be sent to the Internet through a wired Ethernet connection.

As the wireless network works as a two-way traffic the data received from the internet will also pass through the router to be coded into a radio signal that will be received by the computer's wireless adapter.

#### What is a Hotspot?

The term hotspot is used to define an area where WiFi access is available. It can either be through a closed wireless network at home or in public places such as restaurants or airports. In order to access hotspots your computer should include a wireless adapter. If you are using an advanced laptop model it will probably include a built-in wireless transmitter already. If it doesn't you can purchase a wireless adapter that will plug into the PCI slot or USB port. Once installed your system should automatically detect the WiFi hotspots and request connection. If not, you can use software to handle this task for you.

#### What is Bluetooth?

Bluetooth is a global wireless communication standard that connects devices together over a certain distance. Think headset and phone, speaker and PC, basketball to smartphone and more. It is built into billions of products on the market today and connects the 'Internet of Things' (IoT) - more on the Internet of Things next month.

How does Bluetooth work?

A Bluetooth device uses radio waves instead of wires or cables to connect to a phone or computer. A Bluetooth product, like a headset or watch, contains a tiny computer






Ian Paine is the talented graphic novelist of a very successful comic book series whose main characters are Fatboy and Priss. Ian Paine drinks a lot of alcohol. He takes a lot of drugs, mostly prescription or over-the-counter type ones although he has used almost all of the illegal ones as well. He works





Ian's relationship with Priss is extremely close but even he realises it isn't a healthy one. When they were young he was not a popular kid, overweight and often bullied. Priss came to his rescue time after time. Unpleasant things happened to people who were not nice to Ian. As they have grown older Ian has struggled to keep his family secrets at bay and himself on the straight and narrow. Priss has grown angrier and more volatile.

When Ian meets Megan, a sweet, innocent whose job is childcare, Ian feels love which makes him want to be a better person, have a better life. He wants to have a normal relationship, marry and have children. Unfortunately Priss isn't so keen on that. She doesn't want change, it makes her angry and when Priss is angry, bad things happen.

I really enjoyed this novel; the twists and turns, trying to work out what was actually going on with Ian, who Priss really is, who Ian really is......

# National Stroke week 2016 September 12th - 18th

#### What is a stroke?

A stroke is not a heart attack. A stroke occurs when the supply of blood to the brain is suddenly disrupted. Blood is carried to the brain by blood vessels called arteries. Blood may stop moving through an artery because the artery is blocked by a clot or plaque or because the artery breaks or bursts.

When blood stops flowing the brain does not receive the oxygen it needs. Therefore brain cells in the area die and permanent damage may be done.

Some strokes cause permanent or temporary disability. Some people are able to make a full recovery after a stroke.

#### **How can I prevent stroke?**

#### **Know the risk factors:**

Some of the risk factors for stroke cannot be controlled. These include age, gender and a family history of stroke.

However, there are a number of risk factors for stroke you can control to reduce your chance of having a stroke. Blood pressure is one of the most important known risk factors for stroke.

High blood pressure is when your blood pressure is over 140/90. This is known as hypertension. Normal blood pressure is around 120/80.

High normal blood pressure is around 120/80 and 140/90

#### Statistics on stroke

- Australians will suffer more than half a million first ever strokes in the next 10 years.
- One in three people die within a year of having a stroke.
- Stroke kills more women than breast cancer.
- Stroke kills more men than prostate cancer.
- 20 percent of people who experience a stroke are under the age of 55.
- Men are more likely to suffer a stroke at a younger age.
- Stroke is the second biggest killer and one of the leading causes of disability amongst adults in Australia.

#### Remember: Think F.A.S.T. Act Fast.

FACE: Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

ARMS: Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

**SPEECH**: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Is their speech slurred or strange?

IME: If you observe any of these signs call 000 immediately.





#### Make the most of Spring

#### Feed and fertilise

- Use slow-release fertiliser over your entire garden. This will be deeply absorbed into the soil when it rains encouraging vigorous growth and flowering.
- Apply a complete lawn food to all grass-covered areas.
- Apply liquid fertiliser to early plantings (you'll need to wait until rhododendrons and azaleas have flowered). Feed citrus before they start flowering
- In preparation for summer mulch the whole garden to insulate it against the heat. Remove all weeds and encroaching grass first and ensure your mulch is 5cm thick.
- Add compost to the soil of any annual, perennial and bulb plantings and dig over so they're ready for new plantings.

#### Plant and Re-pot

- Ensure your garden is prepared and extended if necessary to accommodate new plantings. Check that you are thinking about the space a plant needs as it grows before planting and refer to plant labels for further information.
- Begin planting seedlings in garden beds, large pots and containers. Re-pot into larger pots if required, trim roots or if you are re-using an old pot, be sure to freshen up the potting mix.
- Don't forget your indoor pot plants! Give them plenty of attention as well.
- Finish planting shrubs, bare-rooted trees and vines.
- Sow the seeds of and plant early-flowering spring annuals that will add instant colour to your garden (try daffodils, polyanthus and tulips).
- Consider planting herbs such as basil and parsley in a window box or pot. Grow vegies ready for summer salads like snowpeas, cucumbers and tomato. If you're planting tomatoes (as well as tall shrubs and fruit trees), you should check to see if you need to buy any stakes to encourage optimum growth.

#### Prune

- Remove any spent flowers and prune any frostdamaged growth.
- Clip back any wayward shrubs that are fast-growing and summer-flowering, such as hibiscus, by one third. Prune azaleas after they flower.
- Make way for spring growth by removing old canes or stakes from grasses and perennials.

- Once or twice weekly, you should be watering with deep soakings as roots go deeper and are less vulnerable to heat than in summer.
- Clean out leaves and floating debris from pools and ponds and add this to your compost.







chip with a Bluetooth radio and software that makes it easy to connect. When two Bluetooth devices want to talk to each other, they need to pair. Communication between Bluetooth devices happens over short-range, ad hoc networks known as piconets. A piconet is a network of devices connected using Bluetooth technology. The network ranges from two to eight connected devices. When a network is established, one device takes the role of the master while all the other devices act as slaves. Piconets are established dynamically and automatically as Bluetooth devices enter and leave radio proximity.

#### What is a USB?

Also commonly called a 'thumb drive', a 'memory stick', a 'flash drive', a 'jump stick' or a 'whatchamacallit'

A USB is a small, ultra-portable storage device which unlike a traditional hard drive has no moving parts. USBs connect to computers and other devices via a built-in USB Type-A plug making it a combination USB device and cable. Short for Universal Serial Bus, USB is a plug-and-play interface which allows a computer to communicate with peripheral and other devices. USB-connected devices cover a broad range; anything from keyboards and mice, to music

players and flash drives.

A USB may also be used to send power to certain devices, such as smartphones and tablets, as well as charge their batteries. The Universal Serial Bus industry standard was established in 1995, and then quickly adopted by Intel, Compaq, Microsoft and other companies. All modern computers now have at least one USB port.

#### Benefits of using a USB

Besides being very small and cheap, USBs are really simple to use: plug one into a computer's USB port and you can access the documents stored on the drive immediately.

USBs are great for storing any data you may wish to have with you at all times or files needing to be transferred from one device to another. They are excellent for storing photos.


