



Internet scams

A lot of internet scams take place without the victim even noticing. You can greatly reduce the chances of being scammed on the internet if you follow some simple precautions.

What to look for

Spam — scammers use the internet to promote fraud through unsolicited or junk emails, known as spam. Even if they only get a handful of replies from the millions of emails they send out, it is still worth their while. Be wary of replying, even just to 'unsubscribe', because that will give a scammer confirmation that they have reached a real email address.

Any email you receive that comes from a sender you do not know, is not specifically addressed to you and promises you some benefit is likely to be spam.

Malicious software - also referred to as malware, spyware, key loggers, trojan horses, or trojans—poses online security threats. Scammers try to install this software on your computer so that they can gain access to files stored on your computer and other personal details and passwords.

Scammers use a wide range of tricks to get their software onto your computer. They may trick you into clicking on a link or pop-up message in a spam email or by getting you to visit a fake website set up solely to infect people's computers.

Online auctions and internet shopping can be a lot of fun and can also help you find good deals. Unfortunately, they also attract scammers.

Scammers will often try to get you to deal outside of online auction sites. They may claim the winner of an auction that you were bidding on has pulled out and offer the item to you. Once you have paid, you will never hear from them again and the auction site will not be able to help you.

Malware is programming or files developed for the purpose of doing harm. Malware includes computer viruses, worms and trojan horses.

Spyware is software installed on a computing device that takes information from it without the consent or knowledge of the user and gives that information to a third party. Spyware is an intelligence-gathering tool — it is used to literally spy on people and collect information about them. People who install spyware may be targeting information such as banking and credit card details or other sensitive commercial or private information.

They may take this information for their own use or give it to another person.

A **trojan horse** contains malicious or harmful coding in apparently harmless programming or data that can take control and do its chosen form of damage, such as ruining the hard disk. A trojan horse may be widely redistributed as part of a computer virus and you may not be aware that it is on your computer.

A **key logger** is software that logs a user's keystrokes as they type to capture private information, passwords or credit card or financial information. Occasionally, key loggers can be physical devices attached to a computer.

REMEMBER If you choose to shop online or participate in online auctions, make sure you know about refund policies and dispute-handling processes and be careful that you are not overcharged. Also, you may want to use an escrow service. This service will hold your payment and only release it to the seller once you have confirmed that you received what you paid for. There is usually a small fee for this service.

CAUTION Never buy from bidders with poor ratings on auction sites and do your best to ensure that you are only making purchases from genuine shopping sites.

THINK Don't reply to spam emails, even to unsubscribe, and do not click on any links or call any telephone number listed in a spam email. Make sure you have current protective software or get advice from a computer specialist.

INVESTIGATE If an email or pop-up offers you a product or service that genuinely interests you and it seems reasonable, be sure that you understand all the terms and conditions and costs involved before making a purchase or providing your details.





Self Care Health Facts Column By John Bell - July 2014

Breastfeeding

To encourage the uptake of breastfeeding, World Breastfeeding Week is held every August. This year it is from 1–7 August 2014 and the theme is 'Breastfeeding: A Winning Goal - for Life!' The theme asserts the importance of increasing and sustaining the protection, promotion and support of breastfeeding.

The rate of breastfeeding is a worldwide issue. On 1 May 2012, UNICEF issued a statement of concern about the major declines in breastfeeding rates across East Asia in relation to deteriorating infant and child health. One of the United Nations Millennium Development Goals (MDG) project goals is to reduce child mortality. It has been reported in 65% of the world's infant population aged one year or less, only 35% are exclusively breastfed between birth and four months of age.

The objectives of World Breastfeeding Week 2014 are:

- To inform people about the MDGs and how they relate to breastfeeding and infant and young child feeding.
- To showcase the progress made so far and the key gaps in breastfeeding and infant and young child feeding.
- To call attention to the importance of stepping up actions to protect, promote and support breastfeeding as a key intervention in the MDGs.
- To stimulate interest among young people of both genders to see the relevance of breastfeeding in today's changing world.

The benefits of breastfeeding are well known. The Australian Breastfeeding Association (https://www.breastfeeding.asn.au/) outlines why breastfeeding is important. Breast milk:


- Is designed by nature for human infants
- Is a complete food containing all your baby's nutritional needs for the first 6 months of life
- Satisfies both hunger and thirst; extra water is not needed
- Increases a baby's resistance to infection and disease

For mothers, breast milk:

- Is convenient, cheap and always available
- Is always fresh, clean and safe
- Quickly soothes a fussy, unhappy baby
- Helps the uterus return to its normal size after childbirth
- Reduces the risk of cancer of the breast and ovaries
- Helps create a close and loving bond between mother and baby

Breastfeeding, however, is not always easy. Some women have concerns and issues with breastfeeding, and most women need support to establish and continue breastfeeding.

Your local pharmacy is your health destination and can help by providing advice and counselling on breastfeeding and associated issues.



Medicines and other substances used by a breastfeeding mother may pass through breast milk to the baby. This includes prescription and non-prescription medicines, herbal medicines, alcohol, nicotine, caffeine and illicit drugs. Health authorities advise breastfeeding mothers to avoid social and recreational drugs, limit their use of non-prescription medicines, alcohol and caffeine and stop smoking. Both nicotine and cigarette smoke have serious effects on babies.

Many pharmacies also offer professional baby clinic services with registered midwives, child health nurses and lactation consultants. At these baby clinics you can get lactation advice and breastfeeding support.

You can also ask your pharmacy about hiring electric breast pumps. Many women need to use breast pumps as they establish breastfeeding. These can be expensive to buy so hiring from your local pharmacy can help you to manage these costs.

Your local pharmacy is also the source for all your breastfeeding products including nipple creams, nipple shields, nursing pads and feeding equipment for expressed breast milk.

In addition, your local Self Care pharmacy has the Self Care Fact Card – *Medicines and Breastfeeding* – to help. Gardens, Gardening and Gardeners

Pushing the climate boundaries

Changes in first-flowering times are more than a mere curiosity. A warming climate changes the range of plants that can be grown in an area and affects those already growing.

Early flowering can reduce pollination, affect fruit set and make some plants more susceptible to frost damage. Flowers may also bloom before pollinators are active.

Whether it is in response to climate change or just a desire to push the boundaries of conventional garden wisdom, there are changing attitudes to gardening everywhere. Some traditionally grown plants are being discarded – often in response to changes in rainfall and higher summer temperatures – while others are being planted.

Some gardeners see their backyards as a place to experiment with new varieties or to try to push plants beyond their normal comfort zones by growing bananas, pineapples and coffee plants in climates better suited to apples, pears and plums.

If you've put in some new plants over summer, keep in mind winter is not far away. To give heat-loving plants a chance, make sure they are growing in the warmest part of your garden. Nestled against the warmth of a north-facing brick wall is an ideal location. Also make sure the soil is well drained as cold, wet conditions in winter can be fatal. Have hessian or old sheets on hand for added protection on cold nights, especially when frosts are

forecast. Grafted warm climate plants (including citrus) benefit from added protection around their graft area. These can be wrapped with cardboard.

August in the garden

On the coast, early blossom trees are coming out. Magnolias are about to bloom and daffodils are popping up.

- The main task this month is to plant, water and feed spring flowering annuals to ensure a spectacular display over the next few months.
- Start preparing the vegetable garden. Dig in well-rotted animal manure, composted organic material and blood and bone. The more time spent preparing the soil, the better the results.
- Eradicate moss from lawns by treating each square metre with 30g of sulphate of iron dissolved in 4.5 litres of water. Rake off dead moss after 10 days. Spiking the lawn with a garden fork for aeration, improved drainage and regular fertilising all help to keep lawns moss-free.
- Earthworms are a sign your soil is fertile. When you add organic matter such as leaves and cow manure to your garden soil you will attract earthworms, the worms will add nutrients from their castings and make aeration tunnels.

What to plant in August . . .

Plant in Garden: Beans, beetroot, carrots, Chinese cabbage, chives, cucumber, kohlrabi, lettuce, parsnips, potato, pumpkin, silverbeet, spring onions, sweet corn, turnips.

Start in Seed Trays: Basil, cabbage, capsicum, celery, eggplant, leeks, tomatoes, zucchini.

The Help by Kathryn Stockett

Be prepared to meet three unforgettable women.

Twenty-two-year-old Skeeter has just returned home after graduating from Ole Miss. She may have a degree but it is 1962, Mississippi and her mother will not be happy till Skeeter has a ring on her finger. Skeeter would normally find solace with her beloved maid Constantine, the woman who raised her, but Constantine has disappeared and no one will tell Skeeter where she has gone.

Aibileen is a black maid, a wise, regal woman raising her seventeenth white child. Something has shifted inside her after the loss of her own son, who died while his bosses looked the other way. She is devoted to the little girl she looks after though she knows both their hearts may be broken.

Minny, Aibileen's best friend, is short, fat and perhaps the sassiest woman in Mississippi. She can cook like nobody's business but she can't mind her tongue so she's lost yet another job. Minny finally finds a position working for someone too new to town to know her reputation. But her new boss has secrets of her own.

Seemingly as different from one another as can be, these women will nonetheless come together for a clandestine project that will put them all at risk. Why? Because within the lines that define their town and their times, they are suffocating. And sometimes lines need to be crossed.

In pitch-perfect voices, Kathryn Stockett creates three extraordinary women whose determination to start a movement of their own forever changes a town and the way women — mothers, daughters, caregivers and friends — view one another. A deeply moving novel filled with poignancy, humor and hope, The Help is a timeless and universal story about the lines we abide by and the ones we don't.
