LinkedIn breach affected 100+ million users A 2012 data breach that was thought to have exposed 6.5 million encrypted passwords for LinkedIn users instead likely impacted more than 117 million accounts, the company now says. In response, the business networking giant has once again forced a password reset for individual users thought to be impacted in the expanded breach.

The 2012 breach was first exposed when a hacker posted a list of some 6.5 million unique passwords to a popular forum where members volunteer or can be hired to hack complex passwords. Forum members managed to crack some the passwords, and eventually noticed that an inordinate number of the passwords they were able to crack contained some variation of "linkedin" in them.

LinkedIn responded by forcing a password reset on all 6.5 million of the impacted accounts but it stopped there. Recently reports surfaced about a sales thread on an online cybercrime bazaar in which the seller offered to sell 117 million records stolen in the 2012 breach.

To stay protected LinkedIn users should update their passwords on the site (and anywhere else they may have reused the same password online) and implement two-factor authentication - a feature that sends a security code to a user's phone upon login.

Sophisticated scams

Think twice before you click on that link – it could hold your computer for ransom. Phishing scams are on the rise and cyber-criminals are combining them with other malicious techniques to extort more money and information from average users around the world. The latest scam combines phishing methods with malware which can restrict access to your computer until the hacker's demands are met.

During March 2016 93 percent of phishing scams were used to distribute ransomware, according to

new research from US-based phishing experts PhishMe. This is a notable shift from traditional phishing schemes where cyber criminals would attempt to extract information from individuals by posing as a representative from companies such as banks or energy companies.

PhishMe's report suggests that ransomware is used in addition to this to restrict access to the user's computer before demanding payment to "unlock" it. This type of attack has been around for some time and generally requires the user to click on a malicious link which then automatically downloads the ransomware.

How to avoid it

Malicious links are still the favoured method of distribution (JavaScript downloaders specifically) so you can protect yourself by: avoiding links that look suspicious and by keeping your anti-virus software up -to-date which gives your computer a better chance of blocking any malware that happens to get through. Cyber-criminals also attach malware scripts to

Cyber-criminals also attach malware scripts to Microsoft Office documents so if you receive a Word file in an email for example do not download it unless you're certain that it's come from a trusted source.

Otherwise standard web-safety practices apply.

Romance and investment scams

Dating and romance scams often take place through online dating websites but scammers may also use social media or email to make contact. They have even been known to telephone their victims as a first introduction. These scams are also known as 'catfishing'.

Scammers typically create fake online profiles designed to lure you in. They may use a fictional name or falsely take on the identities of real, trusted people such as military personnel, aid workers or professionals working abroad.

The Reunion by Sue Walker

This story is about 7 teenagers; Danny, Carrie, Lydia, Alex, Isabella, Simon and Innes who meet and spend 1977 together in, what they refer to as, 'The Unit'. It is an experimental home in Edinburgh for the highly intelligent but seriously dysfunctional teenagers. The psychologists and nurses are Dr Laurie, Sarah, Anna and Ranj - In their experience this group of young teenagers is the most troubled and most difficult they have ever had to deal with.

Although over the years the seven teenagers don't meet up they do have written contact on one day of the year the same day, year after year.

When Innes gets a message on her answering machine from Isabella, twenty-six years after they have left The Unit, she doesn't respond and then a few days later reads in the paper that Isabella has suicided. Innes's shock is compounded further when she hears that Danny too recently died in odd circumstances.

Something happened "way back when" that has terrible repercussions for everyone who resided and worked there. Sue Walker has written "*The Reunion*" in such a way that the reader is constantly to-ing and fro-ing between the present and the past with the latter varying from 26 years ago to anything in between.

The ending is very difficult to predict (which is good) but I found the chopping and changing between characters and alternating between past and present wasn't very smooth - made it a bit hard to keep up with who was doing what.

After Everest by Paul Little

Inside the Private World of Edmund Hillary

A fascinating exploration of the life of mountaineer and adventurer Edmund Hillary, penetrating beyond the legend to reveal a character of paradoxes.

Edmund Hillary is a world icon and a towering figure among adventurers. The interest in him and in his family's dedication to making a contribution to the welfare of the Nepalese people is well known. However, it is the drama of Sir Edmund's later years that throw light into the world of the private man: the death of his wife and daughter in an air crash, his remarriage to the widow of an old friend, and, finally, the falling out, after his own death, of his widow and his eldest son, Peter. All these stories of the Hillary legacy, and the many books written about his life, are about what he did, but this book explores who Edmund Hillary was and the many paradoxes of his character: the individualist who always worked with a team, the lonely boy who ended up loved by millions, the man who could be distant from his own children but is regarded as a surrogate father by thousands of Nepalese, and the leftleaning thinker who accepted the highest order of chivalry from Queen Elizabeth II. This is the story of the man behind the legend.

Making wise choices about medicines

Do you know what to consider when making choices about medicines and talking with your doctor? Weigh up the pros and cons of taking a medicine and how to work with your health professional to make the right decisions for you.

Is this medicine right for me?

To get the best out of your medicines you need to understand them and to think about whether they are right for you.

How much do you want to be involved?

Some people want to be more involved in making decisions about their medicines

than others. Some want to be very involved, do their own research and carefully weigh the benefits and risks of different treatments with their health professionals. Others prefer their health professionals to make the decisions for them. Either way it is important to speak up if you don't understand something or if you have concerns about your medicines.

It's *your* health and what you want is important!

You know your own health concerns, values and priorities better than anyone else. So feel confident to ask questions and discuss your wishes and concerns with your health professional.

How to be medicine-wise

Being medicine-wise will help you ask questions about medicines and medical tests and where to get trusted information. Having the right information will help you make better health decisions for you and those you care for.

Making wise choices

Being medicine-wise starts with making good choices about medicines. Sometimes it is very clear that you need a particular medicine but at other times the decision is not so straight forward. Making wise choices about medicines will help you ask questions and work with your health professional to make the best decision for you.

5 Steps to being medicine-wise

We all take medicines but too often we take them for granted.

Ask questions to get the information you need about medicines and make better informed decisions.

Know it's a medicine. Medicines don't just come on prescription — they include over-the-counter medicines from a pharmacy, supermarket or other store as well as herbal remedies, vitamins and other supplements.

Know the active ingredient. Active ingredients are what make your medicines work. If your pharmacist offers you an alternative brand of a prescription medicine you can be sure it will work the same way as your usual medicine.

Always follow instructions from your doctor or pharmacist and read the labels and packaging of your medicines carefully.

Keep track of all your medicines by using an NPS Medicines List. Your doctor, nurse or pharmacist can help you fill it in. Keep your Medicines List with you especially on visits to your doctor, pharmacist or to the hospital.

Managing your medicines

Managing your medicines well is a big part of being medicine-wise. As well as getting the most benefit from your medicines you can reduce your chances of mishaps that can cause side effects or interactions. Knowing the active ingredient and using a medicines list are two ways to help you take the right medicine at the right time.

Using a Medicines List and having a Home Medicines Review can also help you manage multiple medicines.

The Intelligence of Plants

There is now solid evidence the plants can and do respond to information in the rest of the world. The plant kingdom is a complex society in which members share information and subsequently respond in a way similar to how we do in human society but using different languages. Plants show a number of behaviours that appear to be more than just a simple stimulus and response but which involve communication both within and between plants. They respond to temperature, gravity, light, moisture, infections, concentrations of oxygen and carbon dioxide, predation, physical damage and touch.

Plants whose shoots are infected by disease release gases signaling the threat to nearby plants so stimulating them to strengthen their own chemical defenses.

Some plants have more complex "behaviours". For example, some whose roots are being attacked release gaseous substances which attract nematodes which then kill the predator. Others interact with ants which protect them against attack by organisms which eat them, against disease and against competing plants.

Plants have also developed strategies to increase their reproductive chances. It was, in fact, Charles Darwin in the 1860s who wrote that plants had "responded" to the characteristics of birds and insects so that their reproductive organs were appropriately shaped to allow access for pollination - these pollinators were then "rewarded" with nectar which was attractive to those pollinators and essential to their diets.

Most of us are aware that members of the Fabaceae (legumes such as peas and beans) "domesticate" the *Rhizobium* bacteria in nodules on their roots in return for supply of nitrogen which the bacteria can fix from the atmosphere. It seems too, that the *Rhizobium* bacteria produce hormones, cytokinins and auxins which affect how the plant root behaves in growing to seek nutrients⁶.

Researchers are not claiming that plants have brains or can think rationally but that they communicate in many ways that have similarities to human communication and intelligence. We should understand this if we are to both care for plants and benefit from them.

These studies provide a scientific basis for companion planting where certain plants have been observed to protect others from predation or disease. It's not clear yet whether we might intentionally damage some plants, or plant sacrificial crops, in order that they alert others to strengthen their defences. But we should probably be gentle with the soil everywhere in gardens and forests so that the benefits of communication through mycorrhizal networks are not destroyed.

Perhaps even more interesting is how plants communicate through mycorrhizal networks. These are filaments of fungus that either penetrate the cells of plant roots, or sit on their surface. It is thought that 80-90% of plants have mycorrhizal associations and there are many tens of metres of filaments per gram of soil. These filamentous networks are better at absorbing water and nutrients than the plants themselves and thus they transport and exchange these compounds, increasing their absorption by plants up to 1000 fold.



Do NOT open it.

To verify the legitimacy of a communication

You can check on any communication that you aren't sure about, or report a phone scam, by phoning us on 1800 008 540.

To report an unsolicited email

You can report unsolicited emails claiming to be from the ATO by forwarding the entire email to ReportEmailFraud@ato.gov.au.

Been a victim of a tax-related scam?

If you think you have been a victim of a taxrelated scam, phone us on 1800 008 540 – do so immediately, because your personal details, including your TFN, may be compromised.

You should also contact your bank/financial institution as soon as possible if you provided your credit card details as part of the suspected scam.

Examples of tax-related scams

Scam emails, faxes, SMS and phone calls can look or sound very convincing. You can generally tell they're not genuine because they offer you an unexpected refund or grant and ask you to provide personal information, credit card information or money.

The Australian Taxation Office will never email you asking for personal or credit card details and you should never provide this information without being completely sure who you are dealing with.

Dating and romance scammers will express strong emotions for you in a relatively short period of time and will suggest you move the relationship away from the website to a more private channel such as phone, email or instant messaging. They often claim to be from Australia or another western country but travelling or working overseas.

Scammers go to great lengths to gain your interest and trust such as showering you with loving words, sharing 'personal information' and even sending you gifts. They may take months to build what feels like the romance of a lifetime and may even pretend to book flights to visit you but never actually come.

Once they have gained your trust and your defences are down they will ask you (either subtly or directly) for money, gifts or your banking/credit card details. They may also ask you to send pictures or videos of yourself possibly of an intimate nature.

Often the scammer will pretend to need the money for some sort of personal emergency. For example, they may claim to have a severely ill family member who requires immediate medical attention such as an expensive operation or they may claim financial hardship due to an unfortunate run of bad luck such as a failed business or mugging in the street. The scammer may also claim to want to travel to visit you but cannot afford it unless you are able to lend them money to cover flights or other travel expenses.

Sometimes the scammer will send you valuable items such as laptop computers and mobile phones and ask you to resend them somewhere. They will invent some reason why they need you to send the goods but this is just a way for them to cover up their criminal activity. Alternatively they may ask you to buy the goods yourself and send them somewhere. You might even be asked to accept money into your bank account and then transfer it to someone else.

Warning - the above scenarios are likely to be forms of money laundering which is a criminal offence. Never agree to transfer money for someone else.

Often the scammers tell you about a large amount of money or gold they need to transfer out of their country, offering you a share. They'll tell you they need your money to cover administrative fees or taxes.

Dating and romance scammers can also pose a risk to your personal safety as they are often part of international criminal networks. Scammers may attempt to lure their victims overseas, putting you in dangerous situations that can have tragic consequences.

Regardless of how you are scammed you could end up losing a lot of money. Online dating and romance scams cheat Australians out of millions every year. The money you send to scammers is almost always impossible to recover and, in addition, you may feel long-lasting emotional betrayal at the hands of someone you thought loved you.
